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# Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD)

#### What is Autism?

Autism is a disability affecting bioneurological development that presents before age 3. It influences the parts of the brain associated with social interaction, communication ability and cognitive function. Autism is described as a spectrum disorder (ASD) due to the variation of symptoms and disabilities.

Currently about 1 in 110 young children in the US are diagnosed with an ASD.

Autism is 4-5x more prevalent in males than females. There are no current findings to implicate higher prevalence due to race, ethnicity or socioeconomic status. The exact etiology is still unknown. PEDS: Pediatric Education Dietitian Services

#### How is Autism Diagnosed?

Diagnosis is reached when 6 specified criteria are met, with at least 2 from group (A) and one from (B) and (C):

- (A) social interaction
- (B) language as used in so-
- cial communication
- (C) symbolic or imaginative play

#### **Treatment Options**

Autism does not influence life expectancy . There is currently no cure for autism, but there are several modalities in place for treatment. Research supports that the earlier an intervention is made, the better the improvement in overall symptoms. There is no standard treatment for autism that is universally accepted.

Popular approaches include:

- $\Rightarrow$  Biochemical
- $\Rightarrow$  Neurosensory
- ⇒ Psycho-dynamic
- ⇒ Behavioral

#### Nutrition-Related Treatment for ASD

Food allergen avoidance, specialized food and nutrition supplements are all involved in this treatment approach due to the increased need for these modifications in children with ASD. PEDS offers a variety of services geared at this treatment modality for ASD children and their families. Popular current topics include food acceptance, dietary restrictions, inadequate weight gain and excessive weight gain for age.

All children complete an initial assessment to help determine barriers and strategies to aid in proper growth and development. Assessments are followed by subsequent visits with foodchaining practices, comprehensive, individualized nutrition education to parents and any other relevant topic.
